## A BILL

To amend the Clayton Act with respect to competitive and nondiscriminatory access to the Internet.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Internet Freedom and
- 5 Nondiscrimination Act of 2006".



## 1 SEC. 2. PURPOSES.

- 2 The purposes of this Act are to promote competition,
- 3 to facilitate trade, and to ensure competitive and non-
- 4 discriminatory access to the Internet.

## 5 SEC. 3. AMENDMENTS TO THE CLAYTON ACT.

- 6 The Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. 12 et seq.) is amended—
- 7 (1) by redesignating section 28 as section 29,
- 8 (2) by inserting after section 27 the following:
- 9 "DISCRIMINATION BY BROADBAND NETWORK PROVIDERS
- 10 "Sec. 28. (a) It shall be unlawful for any broadband
- 11 network provider-
- 12 "(1) to fail to provide its broadband network
- 13 services on reasonable and nondiscriminatory terms
- 14 and conditions such that any person can offer or
- 15 provide content, applications, or services to or over
- 16 the network in a manner that is at least equal to the
- 17 manner in which the provider or its affiliates offer
- 18 content, applications, and services, free of any sur-
- 19 charge on the basis of the content, application, or
- 20 service;
- 21 "(2) to refuse to interconnect its facilities with
- 22 the facilities of another provider of broadband net-
- 23 work services on reasonable and nondiscriminatory
- 24 terms or conditions;
- 25 "(3)(A) to block, to impair, to discriminate
- against, or to interfere with the ability of any person

to use a broadband network service to access, to use,
to send, to receive, or to offer lawful content, appli-
cations or services over the Internet; or
"(B) to impose an additional charge to avoid
any conduct that is prohibited by this subsection;
"(4) to prohibit a user from attaching or using
a device on the provider's network that does not
physically damage or materially degrade other users'
utilization of the network; or
"(5) to fail to clearly and conspicuously disclose
to users, in plain language, accurate information
concerning any terms, conditions, or limitations on
the broadband network service.
"(b) If a broadband network provider prioritizes or
offers enhanced quality of service to data of a particular
type, it must prioritize or offer enhanced quality of service
to all data of that type (regardless of the origin or owner-
ship of such data) without imposing a surcharge or other
consideration for such prioritization or enhanced quality
of service.
"(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to pre-
vent a broadband network provider from taking reasonable
and nondiscriminatory measures—
"(1) to manage the functioning of its network

to protect the security of such network and

1	broadband network services if such management
2	does not result in discrimination among the content,
3	applications, or services on the network;
4	"(2) to give priority to emergency communica-
5	tions; or
6	"(3) to prevent a violation of a Federal or State
7	law, or to comply with an order of a court to enforce
8	such law.
9	"(d) For purposes of this section—
10	"(1) the term 'affiliate' means—
11	"(A) a person that directly or indirectly
12	owns, controls, is owned or controlled by, or is
13	under the common ownership or control with
14	another person; or
15	"(B) a person that has a contract or other
16	arrangement with a content or service provider
17	concerning access to, or distribution of, such
18	content or such service;
19	"(2) the term 'broadband network provider'
20	means a person engaged in commerce that owns,
21	controls, operates, or resells any facility used to pro-
22	vide broadband network service to the public, by
23	whatever technology and without regard to whether
24	provided for a fee, in exchange for an explicit ben-
25	efit or for free:



1	"(3) the term 'broadband network service'
2	means a 2-way transmission service that connects to
3	the Internet and transmits information at an aver-
4	age rate of at least 200 kilobits per second in at
5	least one direction, irrespective of whether such
6	transmission is provided separately or as a compo-
7	nent of another service; and
8	"(4) the term 'user' means a person who takes
9	and uses broadband network service, whether pro-
10	vided for a fee, in exchange for an explicit benefit,
11	or for free.", and
12	(3) by amending subsection (a) and the 1st sen-
13	tence of subsection (b) of section 11 by striking
14	"and 8" and inserting "8, and 29".
