## **Internship Requirements**

- Interested undergraduate students must be Texas residents.
- Students must have graduated from high school, completed at least one semester
  of college classes, or have at least one semester of course work remaining before
  they obtain their undergraduate degree. Graduate students or post graduates do
  not qualify for the internship program;
- Our office recognizes the unpredictable nature of academic schedules. However,
  Washington D.C. interns are expected to work <u>FORTY</u> hours per week in Summer
  Sessions, and <u>THIRTY</u> hours a week in Spring and Fall sessions. State office
  hours are scheduled according to academic availability. While semester-long
  internships are preferred for the Spring and Fall Sessions, our office is flexible
  and willing to accommodate you if there is a conflict. Please plan on working a
  minimum of five consecutive weeks during the Summer Session.
- Interns are expected to dress in business attire.
- All the material listed below must be submitted before an application may be considered:
  - Completed Application Form;
  - **Resume** (please include anticipated date of graduation)
  - Official copy of college transcript;
  - Essay: Which of Senator Cornyn's policy stances or professional developments inspires you and why? The essay should be typed, between 800 and 1000 words in length, and double-spaced in 12 point font;
  - Two letters of recommendation.
