IDAHO NOMINEE SCREENED BY JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

Randy Smith introduced by Craig and Crapo

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Idaho Senators Larry Craig and Mike Crapo testified on behalf of Idaho judge Randy Smith as he appeared today before the Senate Judiciary Committee. President Bush nominated Smith to fill a vacancy on the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, of which Idaho is a member.
