H. Con. Res. 159 — Recognizing the sacrifices being made by the families of members of the Armed Forces and supporting the designation of a week as National Military Families Week — as introduced (Boozman)

<u>Order of Business</u>: The resolution is scheduled for consideration on Wednesday, June 8, under a motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill.

<u>Summary</u>: H. Con. Res. 159 would "recognize the sacrifices being made by the families of members of the Armed Forces and supporting the designation of a week as National Military Families Week." Several of the resolution's findings are listed below:

- ➤ The people of the United States have a sincere appreciation for the sacrifices being made by the families of members of the Armed Forces while their loved ones are deployed in the service of their country;
- ➤ Military families face unique challenges while their loved ones are deployed because of the lengthy and dangerous nature of these deployments;
- ➤ The strain on military family life is further increased when these deployments become more frequent.

The resolution resolves that Congress:

- (1) "recognizes the sacrifices of military families and the support they provide for their loved ones serving as members of the Armed Forces; and
- (2) "supports the designation of a week as National Military Families Week."

<u>Committee Action:</u> H. Con. Res. 159 was introduced on May 19, 2005, and referred to the Committee on Armed Services. The Committee has taken no action on the bill.

<u>Cost to Taxpayers:</u> The resolution authorizes no expenditure.
