Appropriations Policy Brief

H.R. 2985 – Legislative Branch Appropriations Act for FY 2006

The Committee Bill is:

- > \$107 million (3.9%) more than last year
- > \$270 million (9.4%) less than the request

Budget Compliance: According to CBO, the bill is within the 302(b) allocation provided for legislative branch appropriations and thus complies with the Budget Act.

<u>Unauthorized Appropriations</u>: According to the Committee report, the bill contains no unauthorized appropriations.

Items of Note:

Continuity in Representation Act: Includes text almost identical to H.R. 841, which passed the House of Representatives on March 3, 2005, by a vote of 329 to 68. The one change involves the section requiring that, in "extraordinary circumstances," the executive authority of any state which has a vacancy for the House of Representatives issue a writ of election to fill such vacancy by special election within 49 days (H.R. 841 said within 45 days) of the U.S. House Speaker's announcement of the vacancy (unless a regularly-scheduled election or other special election for the vacant office is already due to occur within 75 days of the Speaker's announcement). Excess MRA Funds for Deficit Reduction: Continues language carried in previous years providing that excess funds in the Members' Representation Allowance Account shall be used for deficit reduction.

Mounted Horse Unit: Prohibits the Capitol Police from operating its mounted horse unit and transfers all horses, equipment, and supplies to the U.S. Park Police.

Capitol Police Inspector General: Establishes an Office of the Inspector General within the Capitol Police.

Private Vehicles: Prohibits funds in this bill from being used to maintain or otherwise care for private vehicles.

Compensation Limitation: Prevents any Legislative Brach employee from being paid more than a Member of the House or Senate (excluding in-kind benefits and related payments).

Library of Congress Rescission: Rescinds \$16 million from the National Digital Information Infrastructure and Preservation Program.

Capitol Hill Visitors Center: Provides \$37 million "to complete the cost of construction…as requested by the Architect" of the Capitol. This level of funding is \$36 million under the request. The bill also establishes a Capitol Visitor Center Governing Board composed of Congressional Leadership to address the daily operations of the Visitor Center.

Miscellaneous Items: Provides \$703,000 for "miscellaneous items" including House automobiles (\$143,000), interparliamentary receptions (\$40,000) and "gratuities to beneficiaries of deceased staff [employees of the House]" (\$520,000).
