

# MEET ME AT THE FLAG POLE

#### ABOUT THIS EVENT:

Congressman Neugebauer periodically hosts a small event at local schools that honors the American flag. This event teaches students the value and history of the American flag as well as the importance of being involved in the democratic process. This is also a great way for Congressman Neugebauer to reach out to his constituents and show his support of education.

#### **PREPARATION**

#### Who is involved?

District staff, scheduler and press secretary.

# Are any outside groups involved?

Local school – Principal or Superintendent

#### **Timeframe for preparation:**

- Start planning for the event about three or four weeks before the event. Ask the school principal or superintendent if it is something that they would like to do.
- Best time to schedule the event is early in the morning at the beginning of school.

#### PRESS COMPONENT

#### What press did you invite?

Local newspaper.

## What went into your press plan for the event?

Media advisory / press release informing them of the event.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

### How often do you hold this event?

Periodically when the Congressman is in the district.

#### **Supplies:**

Podium with microphone

Flag that has been flown over the United States Capitol; to be donated to the school.

### **Order of Events:**

- 1. Have the school principal assemble the students/faculty by their flag pole. Include school band to play Star-Spangled Banner.
- 2. Have the school's student government president introduce the Member of Congress.
- 3. Give a short speech about the flag and what it means to Americans. Also talk about the importance of voting in America.
- 4. Present a flag that has been flown over the Capitol to the students.
- 5. Have the school officials raise the flag on the flag pole while the band plays the Star-Spangled Banner.
- 6. Have the Member of Congress lead everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.
