

### The Bush Economy Slowest Job Growth of Any Administration in over 70 Years




### The Bush Economy Slowest Private Sector Job Growth of Any Administration in over 70 Years

### The Bush Economy The Most Protracted Postwar Jobs Slump


**Nonfarm Payroll Employment**

# The Bush Economy Unemployment Rate up by 0.2 Percentage Point


**Civilian Unemployment Rate**


# The Bush Economy Almost 700 Thousand More Unemployed Workers

**Civilian Unemployment** 




### The Bush Economy Almost 60 Percent More Long-Term Unemployment

**People Unemployed More than 26 Weeks** 






# The Bush Economy Typical Worker's Earnings Failed to Keep Up with Inflation

Change in Real Usual Weekly Earnings of Full-Time Workers






#### Large Projected Surpluses Turned into Large Deficits

Federal Budget Surpluses and Deficits and CBO Baseline Projections





**Bush Administration Projections of Public Debt in 2008** 




# The Bush Economy Bush Tax Cuts Were Nearly 90 Times Larger for Millionaires Than for Middle Income Households

Average Amount of 2001-2004 Tax Cuts by Household Income, 2005






# The Bush Economy Real Median Household Income Down \$1,273





# The Bush Economy Real Household Income Has Declined for All Income Groups since 2000




### The Bush Economy Administration with Second Largest Average Annual Rise in the Poverty Rate

**Change in Poverty Rate** 




# The Bush Economy 5.4 Million More Americans in Poverty
