Delivering the Benefits They Deserve

In May, Rep. Taylor helped pass H.R. 2528, the *Fiscal Year 2006 Military Quality of Life Appropriations* bill. This bill contains some of the highest levels of veterans funding in history.

- ✓ Veterans medical care is funded at its highest level ever with a \$1.6 billion increase over FY05, a 40 percent increase in funding since 2001
- \$20 billion is provided for the Defense Health Program, an increase of \$1.8 billion over the enacted level of FY05
- ✓ Veterans mental health services funding is \$2.2 billion which includes a comprehensive study on post traumatic stress disorder
- ✓ Other veterans benefits have also been increased by \$1.5 billion over FY05. This increase includes expanded benefits for our Guard and Reserve soldiers, such as increased TRICARE coverage.

Rep. Taylor recently helped pass the *Veterans Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2005*, which passed the House in July. This legislation provides a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) to disability compensation rates for veterans with service-connected disabilities, equal to the adjustment provided under Social Security.

Rep. Taylor is also a cosponsor of the *Military Surviving Spouses Equity Act*. This bill would repeal the offset from surviving spouse annuities under the military Survivor Benefit Plan for amounts paid as dependency and indemnity compensation.

A Record of Standing Up for WNC Seniors

Since Rep. Taylor first came to office, he has been able to secure more than \$75 million for the Asheville VA Medical Center, turning it into one of the finest, most modern VA Medical Facilities in the country. These funds have been able to:

- Construct new 120 bed Nursing Home Care Unit (NHCU)
- Renovate main building and administration building to correct space deficiencies
- ✓ Construct clinical addition
- Establish MRI capability with clinical addition

- Establish inpatient hospice
- Renovate 7 patient wards
- Expand Home Based Primary Care program
- Establish PTSD Clinical Team and PTSD program
- Establish day treatment center



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
