Dear Friends,

The House recently debated a resolution to stay the course in Iraq. I voted against that resolution because I strongly believe we need a change of course in Iraq - one that includes bringing American combat troops home.

Last December, Congress voted that 2006 should be a year of transition in Iraq. We need to send a message to the Iraqi government that U.S. troops will not remain in Iraq indefinitely. Although we should not announce a specific timetable for withdrawal of U.S. combat troops, I do believe it is reasonable for the United States to begin the process of removing troops this year, with a reasonable expectation that all U.S. combat forces will be out of Iraq by the end of 2007.

I also have called for an International Iraq Conference to work with the international community to build a lasting peace in Iraq.

Our nation has paid a heavy price in American lives and resources. More than 2,500 U.S. soldiers have died and 18,000 have been wounded. We have spent more than \$300 billion in Iraq. It's time to change course and develop a plan that will bring our soldiers home.
