In January the new Medicare Part D drug benefit went into effect. Unfortunately, millions of seniors, particularly low-income seniors, have had serious problems getting the medications they need.

Low-income seniors were promised "special assistance" in paying for their medications. By law, they are exempt from any deductible and copayments are not to exceed \$5.

But because of serious problems in implementing the new Part D benefit, many of these seniors continue to have problems receiving the medications they were promised. At least 26 states have stepped in to help seniors pay for their medications, at least temporarily.
