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Dear Friends,

Earlier this month, all Medicare beneficiaries started to receive information about the new Medicare prescription drug plans that will be available to them on Jan. 1, 2006. Maryland seniors face a dizzying array of choices: 47 different plans with different lists of prescriptions that will be covered, and with monthly premiums that will vary from \$6.44 to \$68.91.

I voted against the 2003 *Medicare Modernization Act* because it did not offer a guaranteed prescription drug benefit through Medicare, with set premiums, deductibles, and copayments. Instead, the 2003 law subsidizes private companies who in turn offer polices in which they can determine premiums, deductibles, co-payments and even which drugs are covered.

On Nov. 15, seniors can begin to enroll in the prescription drug plan of their choice. Unfortunately, the promotional information from the federal government and materials from private companies are often difficult to understand and interpret. For that reason, I urge all Medicare beneficiaries to contact their local State Health Insurance Program (SHIP) or Center of Medicare/Medicare Services (CMS) at the following numbers:
