Dear Friends,

Next week, I have scheduled a series of **Social Security Town Hall Meetings** to discuss with you the changes that have been proposed in the Social Security program. The Social Security Trustees have stated that the program is fully solvent for another 37 years, but that adjustments will be needed to guarantee 100% solvency after 2042.

The President has proposed fundamental changes to the program by allowing Americans to divert one-third of their payroll taxes into private accounts. While I believe the Social Security system needs to be strengthened, diverting money from the program will only weaken it.

I hope to see you at one or more of the Town Hall meetings I have scheduled for an informative discussion about the future of Social Security.
