

Bills Signed into Law March 2004

Total number of bills and resolutions signed into law in March 2004: 9

Total costs of bills signed into law in March 2004:

- Authorizations over five years: \$171.6 million
- Net change in mandatory spending over five years: -\$85.0 million
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2004: **\$0**
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2005: **\$0**
- Net change in federal revenue over five years: +\$13.0 million

<u>H.R. 743</u>

Public Law 108-203

Social Security Protection Act

Signed into law: March 2, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: Authorizes \$113.0 over five years, reduces mandatory spending by \$300.0 million over five years, and increases revenues by \$13.0 million over five years

<u>S. 253</u> Public Law 108-204

Native American Technical Corrections Act

Signed into law: March 2, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: Authorizes \$56.0 million over five years

<u>H.R. 3915</u>

Public Law 108-205

To provide for an additional temporary extension of programs under the Small Business Act and the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 through May 21, 2004

Signed into law: March 15, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: No costs above the baseline

<u>S. 714</u> Public Law 108-206

To provide for the conveyance of a small parcel of Bureau of Land Management land in Douglas County, Oregon, to the county to improve management of and recreational access to the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area

Signed into law: March 15, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: No cost to taxpayers

<u>S. 2136</u>

Public Law 108-207

An original bill to extend the final report date and termination date of the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States and to provide additional funding for the Commission

Signed into law: March 16, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: No new costs to taxpayers

<u>H.R. 506</u> Public Law 108-208

Galisteo Basin Archaeological Sites Protection Act

Signed into law: March 19, 2004

Cost: Authorizes about \$2.5 million over five years

Public Law 108-209

Fort Bayard National Historic Landmark Act

Signed into law: March 19, 2004

Cost: Authorizes \$0.1 million over five years

<u>S. 2231</u>

Public Law 108-210

A bill to reauthorize the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families block grant program through June 30, 2004

Signed into law: March 31, 2004

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$58.0 million in FY2004 and by \$209.0 million over five years

<u>S. 2241</u> Public Law 108-211

To reauthorize certain school lunch and child nutrition programs through June 30, 2004

Signed into law: March 31, 2004

Cost: Increases mandatory spending by \$6.0 million in FY2004
