Bills Signed into Law

May 2005

Total number of bills and resolutions signed into law in May 2005: 4

Total costs of bills signed into law in May 2005:

- Authorizations over five years: \$114.3 million
- Net change in mandatory spending over five years: \$0
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2005: \$82.08 billion
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2006: **\$0**
- Net change in federal revenue over five years: +\$26.0 million

H.J.Res. 19

Public Law 109-11

Providing for the appointment of Shirley Ann Jackson as a citizen regent of the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution

Signed into law: May 5, 2005

<u>Cost</u>: No significant cost to taxpayers

H.J.Res. 20

Public Law 109-12

Providing for the appointment of Robert P. Kogod as a citizen regent of the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution

Signed into law: May 5, 2005

<u>Cost</u>: No significant cost to taxpayers

H.R. 1268

Public Law 109-13

Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War on Terror, and Tsunami Relief, 2005

Signed into law: May 11, 2005

<u>Cost</u>: Appropriates \$82.08 billion in supplemental appropriations for FY2005, increases authorizations by \$100.0 million over five years, and increases revenues by \$26.0 million over five years (FY2005-FY2009).

H.R. 2566

Public Law 109-14

Surface Transportation Extension Act VI (one month of additional transit contract authority)

Signed into law: May 31, 2005

Cost: Increases authorizations by \$14.3 million in June 2005
