

## **Bills Signed into Law** February 2003

Total number of bills and resolutions signed into law in February 2003: 4

Total costs of bills signed into law in February 2003:

- Authorizations over five years: **\$0**
- Net increase in mandatory spending over five years: +\$47.0 million
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2003: \$397.4 billion
- Appropriations for fiscal year 2004: **\$2.2 billion\***
- Net change in federal revenue over five years: **\$0**

## <u>H.J.Res. 18</u>

Public Law 108-5

Making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2003

Signed into law: February 7, 2003

Cost: No new spending above the baseline for fiscal year 2003

## H.R. 16

Public Law 108-6

To authorize salary adjustments for Justices and judges of the United States for fiscal year 2003

Signed into law: February 13, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$47.0 million over five years

H.J.Res. 2 Public Law 108-7

FY2003 Omnibus Appropriations Bill

Signed into law: February 20, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: \$397.4 billion in FY2003 appropriations and \$2.2 billion\* in FY2004 appropriations.

<u>S. 141</u> *Public Law 108-8* 

To improve the calculation of the Federal subsidy rate with respect to certain small business loans

Signed into law: February 25, 2003

Cost: No significant cost to taxpayers
