#### A BILL

To provide a source of funds to carry out restoration activities on Federal lands under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of the Interior or the Secretary of Agriculture, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE AND FINDINGS. 4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the 5 "Federal Lands Restoration, Enhancement, Public Education, and Information Resources Act of 2005". 6 7 (b) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following: 8 (1) Violations of laws and regulations applicable 9 to the use of Federal lands under the jurisdiction of 10 the Secretary of the Interior or the Secretary of Agri-11 culture often result in damages to those lands that re-12 quire expenditures for restoration activities to miti-13 gate the damages. 14 (2) Increased public information and education 15 regarding the laws and regulations applicable to the 16 use of these Federal lands can help to reduce the fre-17 quency of unintentional violations. 18 (3) It is appropriate that fines and other mone-19 tary penalties paid as a result of violations of laws 20 and regulations applicable to the use of these Federal 21 lands be used to defray the costs of such restoration 22 activities and to provide such public information and

education.

- 10 "(A) To cover the cost to the United States 11 of any improvement, protection, or rehabilitation 12 work on the System lands rendered necessary by 13 the action which led to the fine or by similar ac-14 tions.
  - "(B) To increase public awareness of rules, regulations, and other requirements regarding the use of System lands.
  - "(4) Treatment of excess funds.—Moneys referred to in paragraph (3) that the Secretary determines are excess to the amounts necessary to carry out the purposes specified in such paragraph shall be transferred to the Crime Victims Fund established by section 1402 of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (42)
