Dear Mr. President,

I am writing to forward you the attached letter I received from an organization in my district, the Southeast Asian Community Center (SACC). In their letter, SACC explains their shocked dismay over a recent statement you made on the O'Reilly Factor. In that statement you agreed that the South Vietnamese did not fight for their freedom during the Vietnam War, therefore explaining why the South Vietnamese do not have freedom today.

Like SACC, I am very concerned that as the President of the United States you do not understand the Vietnam War. Hundreds of thousands of South Vietnamese fought alongside Americans for freedom from Communism. Reports indicate that almost 300,000 South Vietnamese died during that war, almost six times as much as the American casualty rate. In addition, over 1 million South Vietnamese were wounded. Agreeing that the South Vietnamese "didn't fight for their freedom," is not only factually inaccurate, it is also incredibly offensive to the 1.2 million Vietnamese Americans who have suffered the effects of a war and lost family members and friends who fought with America.

I agree with my constituents, the Vietnamese American community deserves an immediate clarification and, more importantly, an apology. Mr. President, before you disparage 1.2 million Americans again, you should check the facts.

The Vietnamese American Community across the nation is deeply saddened and offended by your response to Mr. O'Reilly's statement on the Fox's O'Reilly Factor dated September 27, 2004.

A segment of the interview contained your answer related to the South Victnamess is as follows:

O'REILLY: The South Vietnamese didn't fight for their freedom, which is why they don't have it today.
BUSH: Yes.

Mr. President, what a shocking statement! This was the hardest direct hit in the face of more than 1.4 million Vietnamese Americans, the 4th largest Asian American group in the US. Mr. President, were you aware of the statistics related to the Vietnam Wat?, the war defended by the South Vietnamese and supported by the US and many other free countries. 58,000 Americans sacrificed their lives and several hundred thousand were injured in this war.
