

Bills Signed into Law **April 2005**

Total number of bills and resolutions signed into law in April 2005: 4

Total costs of bills signed into law in April 2005:

- **Authorizations over five years: \$116.5 million**
- **Net change in mandatory spending over five years: +\$21.5 million**
- **Appropriations for fiscal year 2005: \$0**
- **Appropriations for fiscal year 2006: \$0**
- **Net change in federal revenue over five years: -\$212.0 million**

H.R. 1134

Public Law 109-7

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide for the proper tax treatment of certain disaster mitigation payments

Signed into law: April 15, 2005

Cost: Reduces revenues by \$32.0 million over five years

Public Law 109-8

Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act

Signed into law: April 20, 2005

Cost: Authorizes \$111.5 million over five years, increases mandatory spending by \$21.5 million over five years, and reduces revenues by \$180.0 million over five years.

Public Law 109-9

Family Entertainment and Copyright Act

Signed into law: April 27, 2005

Cost: Authorizes \$5.0 million over five years

Robert T. Matsui United States Courthouse Designation Act

Signed into law: April 29, 2005

Cost: No significant cost to taxpayers
