The Committee bill is: \$3 billion or 11% below last year and \$389 million or 2% below the President's request.

H.R. 5025 includes changes to current law that generate savings that are counted toward the 302(b) allocation of the Transportation-Treasury Appropriations Subcommittee. As a result, the bill complies with the Budget Act. These savings could be stripped during floor consideration (for legislating on an appropriations bill), and the bill would then exceed its allocation. However, H.R. 5025 will **NOT** be considered via a rule that protects unauthorized appropriations from similar points of order, as is normally the case. Thus, Members will be permitted to raise points of order against all unauthorized appropriations (see page 163-164 of the Committee Report for a complete list) in order to ensure that the bill meets its 302(b) allocation throughout the course of floor consideration.

LANGUAGE OF NOTE:

Essential Air Service (EAS): The bill provides \$101.7 million for EAS. The program was created in 1978 to continue air service to communities who received mandated air service prior to deregulation. In the past, some conservatives have expressed concerns that the program was meant to be transitional, that it should be phased out, and that the subsidy per passenger (up to \$200) is particularly high. The Congressional Budget Office estimates that eliminating EAS would save \$1.2 billion over ten years.

<u>Amtrak</u>: The bill provides \$900 million for Amtrak, a decrease of \$318 million over last year's enacted level and the same amount requested by President. According to the Committee Report:

"Although Amtrak continues to operate with substantial losses each and every day at the expense of the American taxpayers, the railroad is finally approaching a place of financial accountability where accounting is not done behind closed doors.....[However] even

though progress has been made at reining in Amtrak's accounting measures, a decrease has not been achieved in the large taxpayer subsidization that Amtrak continues to digest....After 30 years of operation and expenditure of over \$40 billion in federal subsidies, Amtrak still only provides one half of one percent of all intercity transportation, with half of Amtrak's passenger trips taking place in the Northeast Corridor."

The bill also rescinds \$40 million from the effort to shift Amtrak's facilities from Pennsylvania Station in New York to the Farley Post Office Building, across the street. Amtrak no longer wants to move because they would be required to pay rent for the new space, whereas they currently pay no rent. In addition, the project – initially projected to be completed by 1999 and cost \$315 million – could not be finished prior to 2010, costing a total of \$1 billion.

<u>Mass Transit</u>: The bill provides \$7.25 billion for the Federal Transit Administration, a decrease of \$16.7 million over last year's enacted level and \$16.9 million below the President's request.

<u>Matricula Consular</u>: The bill includes a provision (Section 216) prohibiting the Secretary of Treasury from publishing or enforcing regulations permitting financial institutions to accept matricula consular as a valid form of identification.

Banks and Real Estate: The bill maintains language prohibiting the use of funds for rulemaking that may determine that real estate brokerage is a financial activity, as required by the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (P.L. 106-102). If this were determined, national banks and financial holding companies would no longer be prevented from engaging in real estate brokerage and would be allowed to compete with realtors for these services. Some conservatives have argued that preventing banks from engaging in real estate brokerage services goes directly against the intent of Gramm-Leach-Bliley.

<u>Member Pay Raise</u>: The bill does **NOT** include a pay increase for Members of Congress. The pay increase is automatic under existing law unless Congress enacts legislation blocking the pay raise. Any amendment seeking to block the pay raise would be deemed out of order.

EARMARKS:

The bill continues to include earmarks worth millions of dollars, including:

- o \$2 million for the Mantua Creek Overpass in Paulsboro, New Jersey
- o \$1.2 million for the Camden Northern End Parking Garage in Camden, New Jersey
- o \$10 million for Hawaii and Alaska ferry boats
- o \$75 million for metro extension in Washington, D.C.
- o \$52 million for commuter rail extensions in Chicago, IL
- o \$607 million for buses and bus facilities (see pages 86-87 of the Committee Report for a list of the projects)
- \$113 million for the replacement of air traffic control towers (see pages 26-27 of the Committee Report for a list of the projects)
