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1**TITLE VI—RURAL EDUCATION**2**ASSISTANCE**

3 SEC. 601. RURAL EDUCATION.

4 Part J of title X of the Elementary and Secondary
5 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 8271 et seq.) is amend6 ed to read as follows:

7 **"PART J—RURAL EDUCATION INITIATIVE**

8 "SEC. 10951. SHORT TITLE.

9 "This part may be cited as the "Rural Education Ini-10 tiative Act of 1999".

11 "SEC. 10952. FINDINGS.

12 "Congress finds the following:

13 "(1) The National Center for Educational Sta14 tistics reports that 46 percent of our Nation's public
15 schools serve rural areas.

"(2) While there are rural education initiatives
identified at the State and local level, no Federal
education policy focuses on the specific and unique
needs of rural school districts and schools.

"(3) Small school districts often cannot use
Federal grant funds distributed by formula because
the formula allocation does not provide enough revenue to carry out the program the grant is intended
to fund.



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1	"(4) Rural schools often cannot compete for
2	Federal funding distributed by competitive grants
3	because the schools lack the personnel needed to
4	prepare grant applications and the resources to hire
5	specialists in the writing of Federal grant proposals.
6	"(5) A critical problem for rural school districts
7	involves the hiring and retention of qualified admin-
8	istrators and certified teachers (especially in read-
9	ing, science, and mathematics). As a result, teachers
10	in rural schools are almost twice as likely to provide
11	instruction in 3 or more subject areas than teachers
12	in urban schools. Rural schools also face other tough
13	challenges, such as shrinking local tax bases, high
14	transportation costs, aging buildings, limited course
15	offerings, and limited resources.
16	"Subpart 1—Small and Rural School Program
17	"SEC. 10961. FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.
18	"(a) Alternative Uses.—
19	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
20	provision of law, an eligible local educational agency
21	may use the applicable funding, that the agency is
22	eligible to receive from the State educational agency
23	for a fiscal year, to support local or statewide edu-
24	cation reform efforts intended to improve the aca-
25	demic achievement of elementary school and sec-



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1 ondary school students and the quality of instruction 2 provided for the students. 3 "(2) NOTIFICATION.—An eligible local edu-4 cational agency shall notify the State educational 5 agency of the local educational agency's intention to 6 use the applicable funding in accordance with para-7 graph (1) not later than a date that is established 8 by the State educational agency for the notification. 9 "(b) ELIGIBILITY.— 10 "(1) IN GENERAL.—A local educational agency 11 shall be eligible to use the applicable funding in ac-12 cordance with subsection (a) if— 13 "(A)(i) the total number of students in av-14 erage daily attendance at all of the schools 15 served by the local educational agency is less 16 than 600; and 17 "(ii) all of the schools served by the local 18 educational agency are located in a community 19 with a Rural-Urban Continuum Code of 6, 7, 8, 20 or 9, as determined by the Secretary of Agri-

culture; or

"(B) the agency meets the criteria established in subparagraph (A)(i) and the Secretary, in accordance with paragraph (2), grants the local edu-



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- cational agency's request to waive the criteria de scribed in subparagraph (A)(ii).
- "(2) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary shall de-3 4 termine whether or not to waive the criteria de-5 scribed in paragraph (1)(A)(ii) based on certification 6 provided by the local educational agency, or the 7 State educational agency on behalf of the local edu-8 cational agency, that the local educational agency is 9 located in an area defined as rural by a govern-10 mental agency of the State.

"(c) APPLICABLE FUNDING.—In this section, the
term "applicable funding" means funds provided under
each of Titles II, IV, VI, parts A and C of title VII, and
part I of title X.

15 "(d) DISBURSAL.—Each State educational agency that receives applicable funding for a fiscal year shall dis-16 burse the applicable funding to local educational agencies 17 18 for alternative uses under this section for the fiscal year at the same time that the State educational agency dis-19 20 burses the applicable funding to local educational agencies 21 that do not intend to use the applicable funding for such 22 alternative uses for the fiscal year.

23 "(e) SUPPLEMENT NOT SUPPLANT.—Funds used
24 under this section shall be used to supplement and not
25 supplant any other Federal, State, or local education



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funds that would otherwise be available for the purpose 1 2 of this subpart.

3 "(f) SPECIAL RULE.—References in Federal law to 4 funds for the provisions of law set forth in subsection (c) 5 may be considered to be references to funds for this sec-6 tion.

7 "SEC. 10962. PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.

8 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary is authorized to 9 award grants to eligible local educational agencies to en-10 able the local educational agencies to support local or 11 statewide education reform efforts intended to improve the 12 academic achievement of elementary school and secondary 13 school students and the quality of instruction provided for 14 the students.

15 "(b) ELIGIBILITY.—

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"(1) IN GENERAL.—A local educational agency 17 shall be eligible to receive a grant under this section 18 if—

> "(A)(i) the total number of students in average daily attendance at all of the schools served by the local educational agency is less than 600; and

"(ii) all of the schools served by the local educational agency are located in a community with a Rural-Urban Continuum Code of 6, 7, 8,



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or 9, as determined by the Secretary of Agriculture; or

"(B) the agency meets the criteria established
in subparagraph (A)(i) and the Secretary, in accordance with paragraph (2), grants the local educational agency's request to waive the criteria described in subparagraph (A)(ii).

8 "(2) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary shall de-9 termine whether or not to waive the criteria de-10 scribed in paragraph (1)(A)(ii) based on certification 11 provided by the local educational agency, or the 12 State educational agency on behalf of the local edu-13 cational agency, that the local educational agency is 14 located in an area defined as rural by a govern-15 mental agency of the State.

16 "(c) Allocation.—

17 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-18 graph (3), the Secretary shall award a grant to an 19 eligible local educational agency for a fiscal year in 20 an amount equal to the initial amount determined 21 under paragraph (2) for the fiscal year minus the 22 total amount received under the provisions of law 23 described under section 10961(c) for the preceding 24 fiscal year.



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1 (2)DETERMINATION OF THE INITIAL 2 AMOUNT.—The initial amount referred to in para-3 graph (1) is equal to \$100 multiplied by the total 4 number of students, over 50 students, in average 5 daily attendance in such eligible agency plus 6 \$20,000, except that the initial amount may not ex-7 ceed \$60,000. 8 "(3) RATABLE ADJUSTMENT.—

9 "(A) IN GENERAL.—If the amount made 10 available for this subpart for any fiscal year is 11 not sufficient to pay in full the amounts that 12 local educational agencies are eligible to receive 13 under paragraph (1) for such year, the Sec-14 retary shall ratably reduce such amounts for 15 such year.

"(B) ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS.—If additional funds become available for making payments under paragraph (1) for such fiscal year, payments that were reduced under subparagraph (A) shall be increased on the same basis as such payments were reduced.

"(5) CENSUS DETERMINATION.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—Each local educational agency desiring a grant under this section shall conduct a census not later than December 1 of



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each year to determine the number of kindergarten through grade 12 students in average daily attendance at the schools served by the local educational agency.

5 "(B) SUBMISSION.—Each local educational
6 agency shall submit the number described in
7 subparagraph (A) to the Secretary not later
8 than March 1 of each year.

9 "(d) DISBURSAL.—The Secretary shall disburse the
10 funds awarded to a local educational agency under this
11 section for a fiscal year not later than July 1 of that year.
12 "(e) SPECIAL RULE.—A local educational agency
13 that is eligible to receive a grant under this subpart for
14 a fiscal year shall be ineligible to receive funds for such
15 fiscal year under subpart 2.

16 "(f) SUPPLEMENT NOT SUPPLANT.—Funds made
17 available under this section shall be used to supplement
18 and not supplant any other Federal, State or local edu19 cation funds.

20 "SEC. 10963. ACCOUNTABILITY.

21 "(a) ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—Each local educational
agency that uses or receives funds under section
10961 or 10962 for a fiscal year shall administer an
assessment consistent with section 1111 of title I.



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"(2) SPECIAL RULE.—Each local educational
 agency that uses or receives funds under section
 10961 or 10962 shall use the same assessment de scribed in paragraph (1) for each year of participa tion in the program under such section.

6 "(b) STATE EDUCATIONAL AGENCY DETERMINATION
7 REGARDING CONTINUING PARTICIPATION.—Each State
8 educational agency that receives funding under the provi9 sions of law described in section 10961(c) shall—

10 "(1) after the 2d year that a local educational 11 agency participates in a program under section 12 10961 or 10962 and on the basis of the results of 13 the assessments described in subsection (a), deter-14 mine whether the students served by the local edu-15 cational agency participating in the program per-16 formed in accordance with section 1111 of title I; 17 and

"(2) only permit those local educational agencies that so participated and met the requirements
of section 1111(b)(2) of title I to continue to so participate.

22 "Subpart 2—Low-Income And Rural School Program 23 "SEC. 10971. PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.

24 "(a) RESERVATIONS.—From amounts appropriated25 under section 10982 for this subpart for a fiscal year, the



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Secretary shall reserve ¹/₂ of 1 percent to make awards
 to elementary or secondary schools operated or supported
 by the Bureau of Indian Affairs to carry out the purpose
 of this subpart.

- 5 "(b) Grants to States.—
- 6 "(1) IN GENERAL.—From amounts appro-7 priated under section 10982 for this subpart that 8 are not reserved under subsection (a), the Secretary 9 shall award grants for a fiscal year to State edu-10 cational agencies that have applications approved 11 under section 10973 to enable the State educational 12 agencies to award subgrants to eligible local edu-13 cational agencies for local authorized activities de-14 scribed in subsection (c)(2).

15 (2)ALLOCATION.—From amounts appro-16 priated for this subpart, the Secretary shall allocate 17 to each State educational agency for a fiscal year an 18 amount that bears the same ratio to the amount of 19 funds appropriated under section 10982 for this 20 subpart that are not reserved under subsection (a) 21 as the number of students in average daily attend-22 ance served by eligible local educational agencies in 23 the State bears to the number of all such students 24 served by eligible local educational agencies in all 25 States for that fiscal year.



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1	"(3) DIRECT AWARDS TO SPECIALLY QUALI-
2	FIED AGENCIES.—
3	"(A) Nonparticipating state.—If a
4	State educational agency elects not to partici-
5	pate in the program under this subpart or does
6	not have an application approved under section
7	10973 a specially qualified agency in such State
8	desiring a grant under this subpart shall apply
9	directly to the Secretary to receive an award
10	under this subpart.
11	"(B) DIRECT AWARDS TO SPECIALLY
12	QUALIFIED AGENCIES.—The Secretary may
13	award, on a competitive basis, the amount the
14	State educational agency is eligible to receive
15	under paragraph (2) directly to specially quali-
16	fied agencies in the State.
17	"(c) LOCAL AWARDS.—
18	"(1) ELIGIBILITY.—A local educational agency
19	shall be eligible to receive funds under this subpart
20	if—
21	"(A) 20 percent or more of the children
22	aged 5 to 17, inclusive, served by the local edu-
23	cational agency are from families with incomes
24	below the poverty line; and



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1	"(B) all of the schools served by the agen-
2	cy are located in a community with a Rural-
3	Urban Continuum Code of 6, 7, 8, or 9, as de-
4	termined by the Secretary of Agriculture.
5	"(2) USES OF FUNDS.—Grant funds awarded
6	to local educational agencies or made available to
7	schools under this subpart shall be used for—
8	((1) educational technology, including software
9	and hardware;
10	"(2) professional development;
11	"(3) technical assistance;
12	"(4) teacher recruitment and retention;
13	"(5) parental involvement activities; or
14	"(6) academic enrichment programs.
15	"SEC. 10972. STATE DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.
16	"(a) AWARD BASIS.—A State educational agency
17	shall award grants to eligible local educational agencies—
18	"(1) on a competitive basis; or
19	((2) according to a formula based on the num-
20	ber of students in average daily attendance served
21	by the eligible local educational agencies or schools
22	(as appropriate) in the State, as determined by the
23	State.
24	"(b) Administrative Costs.—A State educational
25	agency receiving a grant under this subpart may not use



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more than 5 percent of the amount of the grant for State
 administrative costs.

3 "SEC. 10973. APPLICATIONS.

4 "Each State educational agency and specially quali-5 fied agency desiring to receive a grant under this subpart shall submit an application to the Secretary at such time, 6 7 in such manner, and accompanied by such information as 8 the Secretary may require. Such application shall include 9 specific measurable goals and objectives to be achieved 10 which may include specific educational goals and objec-11 tives relating to increased student academic achievement, 12 decreased student drop-out rates, or such other factors 13 that the State educational agency or specially qualified 14 agency may choose to measure.

15 "SEC. 10974. REPORTS.

16 "(a) STATE REPORTS.—Each State educational
17 agency that receives a grant under this subpart shall pro18 vide an annual report to the Secretary. The report shall
19 describe—

"(1) the method the State educational agency
used to award grants to eligible local educational
agencies and to provide assistance to schools under
this subpart;

24 "(2) how local educational agencies and schools25 used funds provided under this subpart; and



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"(3) the degree to which progress has been
 made toward meeting the goals and objectives de scribed in the application submitted under section
 10973.

5 "(b) SPECIALLY QUALIFIED AGENCY REPORT.—
6 Each specially qualified agency that receives a grant under
7 this subpart shall provide an annual report to the Sec8 retary. Such report shall describe—

9 "(1) how such agency uses funds provided10 under this subpart; and

"(2) the degree to which progress has been
made toward meeting the goals and objectives described in the application submitted under section
10971(b)(4)(A).

15 "(c) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary shall
16 prepare and submit to the Committee on Education and
17 the Workforce for the House of Representatives and the
18 Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions for
19 the Senate an annual report. The report shall describe—

20 "(1) the methods the State educational agency
21 used to award grants to eligible local educational
22 agencies and to provide assistance to schools under
23 this subpart;

"(2) how eligible local educational agencies and schools used funds provided under this subpart; and



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"(3) progress made in meeting specific measur able educational goals and objectives.

3 "SEC. 10975. DEFINITIONS.

"For the purposes of this subpart—

5 "(1) The term "poverty line" means the poverty
6 line (as defined by the Office of Management and
7 Budget, and revised annually in accordance with sec8 tion 673(2) of the Community Services Block Grant
9 Act (42 U.S.C. 9902(2))) applicable to a family of
10 the size involved.

"(2) The term "specially qualified agency"
means an eligible local educational agency, located in
a State that does not participate in a program under
this subpart in a fiscal year, that may apply directly
to the Secretary for a grant in such year in accordance with section 10971(b)(4).

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"Subpart 3—General Provisions

18 **"SEC. 10981. DEFINITION.**

19 "For the purposes of this part, the term 'State'20 means each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia,21 and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

22 "SEC. 10982. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

23 "There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out24 this part \$125,000,000 for fiscal year 2000 and such sums



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- 1 as may be necessary for each of 4 succeeding fiscal years
- 2 to be distributed equally between subparts 1 and 2.".
