Dear Chairmen Grassley and Thomas and Ranking Members Baucus and Rangel:

I am writing on behalf of Independent Sector to express our strong support for the package of charitable giving tax incentives and reforms that has been amended and offered by the Joint Committee on Taxation and Senate Finance Committee staff for inclusion in the final conference bill for the Tax Relief Act of 2005 (H.R. 4297).

Independent Sector is a nonprofit, nonpartisan coalition of more that 500 charitable nonprofits and philanthropic institutions, which collectively represents tens of thousands of charitable groups as well as millions of donors and volunteers serving a wide range of causes in regions across the country. We have worked since our inception to assist our member organizations to meet the highest standards of ethical practice, accountability, and effectiveness. We assembled the Panel on the Nonprofit Sector, a broad effort by thousands of charitable nonprofit organizations to which presented to Congress a comprehensive package of legislative reforms that would strengthen government oversight, accountability and transparency of charitable organizations, and public trust in the important work of charitable organizations in June, 2005.

The package of charitable incentives and reforms that is now being offered to the conference by the Senate Finance Committee will strengthen the work of our sector by deterring and punishing abuses by individuals who exploit charitable organizations for their personal gain, without imposing unnecessary costs or hardships on reputable charities. Moreover, the proposed reforms strike the right balance between legitimate government oversight and protecting the independence that charitable organizations need to remain innovative and effective. We strongly encourage you to include them in the tax bill you are now debating.
