Dear Representative Skelton,

Thank you for allowing the Army to comment on its unfunded requirements for fiscal year (FY) 2007. I and all of our Soldiers deeply appreciate your concern.

The Army remains committed to growing and balancing its capabilities within and across the active and reserve components so that we can support the Nation's global operations; prevail in the Global War on Terrorism and conduct expanded state and homeland security missions. To help fulfill our objectives, we are proceeding apace with the conversion of all components to a modular, interchangeable structure that will be employed according to a new force generation model.

The FY 2007 President's Budget Request supports the Army's enduring mission to provide necessary forces and capabilities to the Combatant Commanders in accordance with the National Security and Defense strategies. The FY 2007 budget, with anticipated supplemental funding, will provide the resources necessary to train and equip our Soldiers; to sustain the all-volunteer force; and to generate the infrastructure required to perform our missions.

The Army would use any additional resources to accelerate our transformation to a modular force; to enhance further the readiness (training and maintenance) of our forces; to improve the quality of life for our Soldiers, families and civilians; and to quicken our restationing initiatives. In accordance with your request, I have attached a list of programs to which we would apply extra funding.

Again, I thank you for your and Congress' sustained support of the United States Army and all of our devoted Soldiers, their families and our civilians. I look forward to continuing working with you to build the best Army possible.
