## FLOOR SCHEDULE AND PROCEDURE

Today, the House will convene at **3:00 p.m.** to consider the DeLay-Pelosi Resolution Expressing Condolences to the Families of the Crew of the Space Shuttle Columbia. Next, the House will debate the 8th Continuing Resolution, making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2003 through February 20<sup>th</sup>.

The House will not be in session on Thursday or Friday, February 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. On Thursday, there will be a memorial service for the crew members of the Columbia Shuttle Mission at the National Cathedral at 10:00 a.m.

- **H.Res. \_\_\_\_ - Expressing the condolences of the House of Representatives to the Families of the Crew Members of the Space Shuttle Columbia (Under Unanimous Consent).** This resolution is nearly identical to the Challenger resolution that was considered in 1986. The resolution is debatable for 2 hours.
- **H.J.Res. 18 - Making further continuing appropriations for the fiscal year 2003, and for other purposes (To be considered either under a Rule or by Unanimous Consent).** The House will consider the 8th Continuing Resolution to provide temporary funding for the Federal government through **Thursday, February 20<sup>th</sup>** under the fiscal year 2002 terms and conditions and funding rates (except functions funded under the Defense and Military Construction Appropriations bills which have already been enacted).

**When the House adjourns today, the next votes are expected after 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, February 11<sup>th</sup>.**
