On December 31, 2005, the R&D tax credit expired once again. An extension of a strengthened R&D credit was included as part of the Senate-passed Tax Relief Act of 2005, and the House-passed Tax Relief Extension Act of 2005. It is imperative that this important provision be enacted as soon as possible.

The Members of the House and Senate have demonstrated strong support for extending the credit and for making changes in the law that will help make the credit a more powerful incentive to undertake long-term, high-risk R&D projects in the United States. We must act to ensure that the changes proposed along with the extension of the current R&D are enacted into law.

The credit expired on December 31, 2005, and now U.S. businesses will have to face the adverse financial consequences. Research projects already in the pipeline will become more expensive and the projected cost of future U.S.-based research activities will rise. For some companies losing this support could be the difference between a project getting the green light or being put back on the shelf.

Moreover, companies must comply with the law as it is. Despite the strong support that Congress has shown for extending the R&D credit, the expired credit can not be assumed in forecasting project costs or reporting financial results. Hiring decisions and project plans hinge on the financial incentives that the credit can provide.

Economists have stated repeatedly that a federal tax incentive for R&D is economically justified because society as a whole benefits from the research that is financed and conducted by private industry. It is also clear that the best incentive is one on which businesses can rely and one that applies broadly to all research-intensive companies.

We must do all we can to take an important step for the future economic growth of the United States by working to enact the extension of a stronger credit that both the House and Senate have already approved.
