Sponsoring Legislation to Solve Problems

Keep Our Promise to America's Children and Teachers Act. This legislation would mandate the full funding our schools were promised when the No Child Left Behind Act was passed.

Truth in Caller ID Act. As part of his efforts to stop identity theft, Engel co-authored legislation to prevent criminals from using fake caller ID services. Criminals have used them to get social security numbers and other personal information.

The FamilyCare Act. It would make parents of children eligible for the State Children's Health Insurance Program and

Engel Fights Against High Gas Prices and to Reduce Foreign Oil Dependency

"It is an outrage that we now have to pay over \$3 for a gallon of gas. The oil industry is reaping billions in profits as hard working Americans struggle to fill their tanks," Congressman Engel stated.

As the co-chair and founder of the bipartisan Oil and National Security Caucus, he has made renewable energy and energy independence a top priority.

To cut foreign oil dependence and lower gas prices, he co-authored the Fuel Choices for American Security Act, which mandates 2.5 million barrels a day in oil-savings in just ten years. It would encourage the mass-production of cars that can burn any combination of gasoline and alternative fuels such as ethanol or powered by fuel efficient hybrid engines.

Engel speaking at the Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Program meeting he held in the Bronx to give seniors information on the program. He voted against the Part D legislation because it failed to provide seniors with relief from the high cost of prescription drugs and is overly complex.



Engel Supports Fair and Just Reform of America's Immigration Laws

Congressman Eliot Engel is a strong supporter of the Secure America and Orderly Immigration Act, the House of Representatives' version of legislation sponsored by United States Senators Edward Kennedy and John McCain.

"America was founded by

immigrants, expanded through the hard work and labor of immigrants. While we want to insure our laws are enforced, we must update and streamline the immigration process to make it fairer," he stated at a recent immigrant rally in Washington, DC.

Congressman Eliot Engel Obtains Federal Funds and Grants for the Bronx

Congressman Eliot Engel has obtained over \$35.5 million in federal funds and grants for the Bronx in just the last eighteen months.

The Federal funds and grants include \$199,900 for a mentoring program in School Board 9, \$562,689 for a learning support center in Education Region 1 and a \$990,614 Teaching American History grant.

Health care will be improved in your community. Over \$4.5 million was secured for the Bronx Community Health Network and over \$5.5 million went to The Bronx Community Health Center, Montefiore Medical Center and Our Lady of Mercy Medical Center.

He obtained \$5,875,200 for senior housing that is being sponsored by the United Church of Christ. The Headstart programs at the Kingsbridge Heights Community Center and the Mosholu Montefiore Community Center in the Bronx received over \$1.3 million.

The Hebrew Home for the Aged received funds for transportation for the elderly and disabled and for health care. Funds were obtained for youth services and training for the Bronx Cluster of Settlement Houses and National Endowment for the Arts funds were obtained for Wave Hill.

The City received funds to continue work on connecting Shoelace Park to Bronx Park.

Millions for Community and Road Improvements

Congressman Eliot Engel has worked to obtain millions for Bronx improvements. The funds obtained include:

- Diamond grinding to the roadway to reduce noise caused by traffic on Mosholu Parkway and I-95
- The study and design of pedestrian walkways in our neighborhoods to improve safety near public schools
- \$1,450,000 to change the abandoned Putnam Rail Line along the Major Deegan Expressway into a new pedestrian greenway
- \$750,000 for the 233rd Street area connection to the Bronx River Greenway

- Funds for the City to improve truck routing to keep trucks out of residential neighborhoods
- A bus system between Jacobi Medical Center and the North Central Bronx Hospital
- \$800,000 to repair and improve the Step Streets
- Transportation improvement in and around the Bronx Zoo

In addition Engel worked with other members of the City's Congressional delegation to secure funds so that the City can make on-going street and bridge repairs.
