I strongly believe in the power of an education. As the Representative of the First Congressional District of Missouri, I know this power should be made available to every student and parent. Education is often a vital tool for achieving success, this is why I would like to assist students in acquiring resources to fund their college education.

In Congress I always support and fight for legislation that increases funding for federal financial aid assistance, such as increased investment in Pell Grants, and legislation that promotes lower interest rates on student loans, such as the Federal Perkins Loan Program. Each year I support Title IV of the Higher Education Act, which authorizes funding for Federal Direct Student Loan Programs, and Federal Family Education Loan Programs, the largest source of financial aid available to students. I also champion the cause of GEAR-UP and TRIO federal programs. GEAR-UP is designed to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in post-secondary education. TRIO Programs are educational opportunity outreach programs designed to motivate and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

In addition to this legislation, I have developed this *Scholarship and College Financial Resources Guide* that I hope will be useful in your search of funding for a higher education. This guide provides you with a range of select scholarships and website addresses for obtaining financial assistance. Your local public library can also be an extremely valuable source of information because they hold numerous publications on scholarship listings, how-to guides, and financial aid.
