H. Con. Res. 424 Brief Summary

H. Con. Res. 424 expresses a sense of Congress that the goal of the United States is that at least 25 percent of the energy consumed in the United States should be the product of the agricultural, forestry, and working lands of the nation. The resolution further provides that along with this production for energy, the United States should continue to produce a sufficient supply of food, feed, and fiber.

Before reaching this resolution, H. Con. Res. 424 states that the production of renewable energy from agricultural, forestry, and working lands is beneficial to national security, rural economies, and the environment. H. Con. Res. 424 further states a belief that the development and use of renewable energy will stabilize the cost and availability of energy in the Unites States and that supportive policies and incentives will make increased use practical and effective.
