Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Reverse the Raid on 5 Student Aid Act of $2006^{\prime \prime}$.

6 SEC. 2. INTEREST RATE REDUCTIONS.
(a) FFEL Interest Rates.—Section 427A(l) (20

8 U.S.C. $1077 \mathrm{a}(l)$ ) is amended-
(1) in paragraph (1)-
(A) by striking " 6.8 percent" and inserting " 3.4 percent"; and
(B) by inserting before the period at the end the following: ", except that for any loan made pursuant to section 428 H for which the first disbursement is made on or after July 1, 2006, the applicable rate of interest shall be 6.8 percent on the unpaid principal balance of the loan"; and
(2) in paragraph (2), by striking " 8.5 percent" and inserting " 4.25 percent".
(b) Direct Loans.-Section 455(b)(7) (20 U.S.C. $1087 \mathrm{e}(\mathrm{b})(7))$ is amended(1) in subparagraph (A)-
(A) by striking "and Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loans";
(B) by striking " 6.8 percent" and inserting " 3.4 percent"; and
(C) by inserting before the period at the end the following: ", and for any Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan made for which the first disbursement is made on or after July 1, 2006, the applicable rate of interest shall be 6.8 per-

4 cent" and inserting "4.25 percent."
