The Government Is Growing

The size of the federal civilian workforce is growing. The figures below show that the number of federal workers decreased in almost every year with Republican control of Congress and Democrat control of the White House. However, the number of federal civilian workers has <u>increased</u> every year with Republican control of Congress <u>and</u> the White House. These figures below do not include federal contractors. Such data will be available soon, and the RSC will update this document accordingly.
