# **The Most Expensive Mandatory Spending Bills of 2003**

This document only includes bills passed by the House.

Medicare Prescription Drug and Modernization Act H.R. 1; Public Law 108-173

Passed the House: June 27, 2003 and November 22, 2003

Signed into law: December 8, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$121.4 billion over five years

How Republicans voted: 207-19-1 (initial House passage); 204-25 (conference report)

How Democrats voted: 9-195 (initial House passage); 16-189 (conference report)

## Surface Transportation Extension Act

H.R. 3087; Public Law 108-88

Passed the House: September 24, 2003

Signed into law: September 30, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$28.8 billion over five years

How Republicans voted: No recorded vote

How Democrats voted: No recorded vote

#### Jobs and Growth Tax Reconciliation Act H.R. 2: Public Law 108-27

Passed the House: May 9, 2003 and May 23, 2003

Signed into law: May 28, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by a net \$20.0 billion over two fiscal years

How Republicans voted: 218-3 (on initial House passage); 224-1 (conference report)

How Democrats voted: 4-199 (initial House passage); 7-198 (conference report)

<u>Unemployment Compensation Amendments of 2003</u> *H.R. 2185; Public Law 108-26* 

Passed the House: May 22, 2003

Signed into law: May 28, 2003

Cost: Increases mandatory spending by \$7.9 billion over two fiscal years

How Republicans voted: 204-19

How Democrats voted: 204-0

<u>Unemployment Insurance Benefits Extension Act</u> S. 23; Public Law 108-1

Passed the House: January 8, 2003

Signed into law: January 8, 2003

Cost: Increases mandatory spending by \$7.565 billion in FY2003

How Republicans voted: 218-4

How Democrats voted: 197-0

**Postal Civil Service Retirement System Funding Reform Act** S. 380; Public Law 108-18

Passed the House: April 8, 2003

Signed into law: April 23, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$7.1 billion over five years

How Republicans voted: 223-0

How Democrats voted: 200-0

## Federal Deposit Insurance Reform Act H.R. 522

Passed the House: April 2, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$3.4 billion over five years (but over <u>ten</u> years will result in a \$700 million net *reduction* in mandatory spending)

How Republicans voted: 215-5

How Democrats voted: 196-5

### **Personal Responsibility, Work and Family Promotion Act of 2003** *H.R. 4*

Passed the House: February 13, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$2.4 billion over five years

How Republicans voted: 219-2

How Democrats voted: 11-189

#### Commercial Spectrum Enhancement Act H.R. 1320

Passed the House: June 11, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$1.4 billion over five years

How Republicans voted: 214-9

How Democrats voted: 193-1

Flight 100 - Century of Aviation (FAA) Reauthorization Act H.R. 2115; Public Law 108-176

Passed the House: June 11, 2003 and October 30, 2003

Signed into law: December 12, 2003

<u>Cost</u>: Increases mandatory spending by \$1.4 billion over five years

<u>How Republicans voted</u>: 220-6 (initial House passage); 210-11 (conference report) <u>How Democrats voted</u>: 197-2 (initial House passage); 1-195 (conference report)
