

UNEMPLOYMENT HAS RISEN IN 47 STATES SINCE BEGINNING OF BUSH ADMINISTRATION

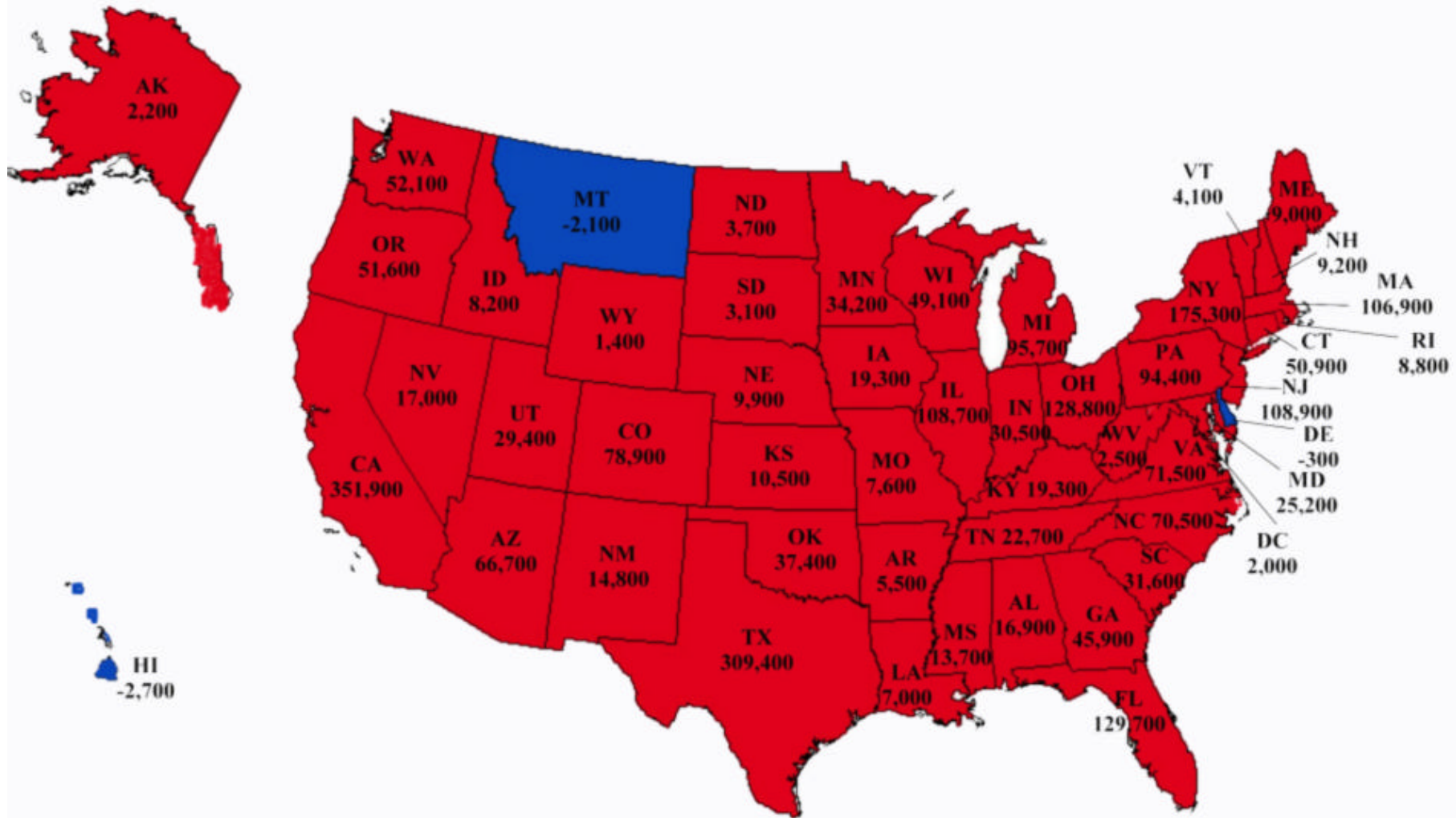
