A BILL

To require that radios used in the satellite digital radio service be capable of receiving terrestrial digital radio signals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Radio All Digital
- 5 Channel Receiver Act".

SEC. 2. MANDATING TERRESTRIAL DIGITAL RADIO RECEIV ERS.

3 (a) COMMISSION AUTHORITY.—Section 303 of the
4 Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 303) is amended
5 by adding at the end the following new subsection:

6 "(z) Require that apparatus shipped in interstate 7 commerce or manufactured in the United States that is 8 designed to receive signals broadcast in both the satellite 9 digital audio radio service and the terrestrial AM or FM 10 radio broadcast service be equipped with technology that 11 is capable of receiving and playing digital radio signals 12 as transmitted by terrestrial AM or FM stations.".

13 (b) PROHIBITION.—Section 330 of such Act (47
14 U.S.C. 330) is amended—

15 (1) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-16 section (e); and

17 (2) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-18 lowing:

"(d)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), no person shall ship in interstate commerce or manufacture in
the United States apparatus described in section 303(z)
of this Act unless such apparatus complies with the rules
prescribed by the Commission pursuant to the authority
granted by that section.

"(2) This subsection shall not apply to carriers trans porting apparatus referred to in paragraph (1) without
 trading in such apparatus.".

4 (c) DEADLINE FOR COMMISSION ACTION.—The Fed5 eral Communications Commission shall take all actions
6 necessary to prescribe rules pursuant to the amendments
7 made by this section within 180 days after the date of
8 enactment of this Act.
