May 22, 2008	H.R. 5658	110 th	Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2009: The Motion to Recommit included a provision to increase the use of alternative fuels like clean coal-to-liquids and oil from oil shale and sands, by repealing Section 526 of the Democrat energy bill, H.R. 6. April 23, 2008	H.R. 5819	110 th	SBIR/STTR Reauthorization Act: The Motion to Recommit would promote alternative fuels and projects that have the potential to lower gasoline and diesel prices. The pro-energy vote was yes.	Yes	NV	Failed 195-215 (Roll Call No. 216)
February 27, 2008	H.R. 5351	110 th	The Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation Tax Act of 2008: This bill included a renewal of energy efficiency and renewable energy tax credits slated to expire at the end of 2008, but also included language that would have imposed billions of dollars of taxes on domestic oil and gas industry, which would lead to higher energy and gas prices. The pro-energy vote was no.	No	Yes	Passed 236-182 (Roll Call No. 83)
August 4, 2007	H.R. 3221	110 th	New Direction for Energy Independence, National Security, and Consumer Protection Act: The Motion to Recommit would have struck the entire text of H.R. 3221 and replaced it with pro-American energy production provisions including more oil and gas from ANWR, the OCS, and oil shale, more refineries, more clean coal, as well as promote more efficiencies and energy technology research & development. The pro-energy vote was yes.	Yes	No	Failed 169-244 (Roll Call No. 831)

August 4, 2007	H.R. 2776	110 th	Punitive Energy Taxes: This bill would raise taxes on American energy production to pay for “green pork” projects. The pro-energy vote was no.	No	Yes	Passed 221-189 (Roll Call No. 835)
June 27, 2007	H.R. 2643 H. Amdt. 448	110 th	Oil Shale (Udall Amendment): Rep. Udall (CO) offered an amendment to prohibit production of the 1.5 Trillion barrels of oil in oil shale on federal lands. The pro-energy vote was no.	No	Yes	Passed 219-215 (Roll Call No. 574)
June 26, 2007	H.R. 2643 H. Amdt. 405	110 th	Expanding U.S. Energy Supplies (Peterson Amendment): Rep. Peterson (PA) offered an amendment that would have lifted the federal moratoria with respect to natural gas pre-leasing, leasing, and related activities beyond 25 miles from U.S. Coastlines. The pro-energy vote was yes.	Yes	NV	Failed 196-233 (Roll Call No. 552)
April 24, 2007	H.R. 363	110 th	Sowing the Seeds Through Science and Engineering Research Act: The Motion to Recommit included a provision that would promote expanded domestic energy production and the use of coal-to-liquids technology and advanced nuclear reprocessing. The pro-energy vote was yes.	Yes	NV	Passed 264-154 (Roll Call No. 256)
February 8, 2007	H.R. 547	110 th	Advanced Fuels Infrastructure Research Developments Act: The Motion to Recommit included provisions that would have increased the supply of alternative clean coal-to-liquids fuels. The pro-energy vote was yes.	Yes	NV	Failed 200-207 (Roll Call No. 91)
January 18, 2007	H.R. 6	110 th	Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007: This bill was loaded down with counterproductive measures that would have raised energy prices. The pro-energy vote was no.	No	Yes	Passed 264-163 (Roll Call No. 40)
