\*\* The model did not specifically predict PFFS enrollment for 2008 but at 100% FFS, we believe PFFS plans to not be viable products. CBO estimates that PFFS enrollment will double to 2.3 million in 2008. If half of those enrollees left MA and returned to traditional Medicare, approximately 3 million would lose MA coverage in total.
