Congressman Scott Shares the Details of the Economic Stimulus Plan *February 7*

Last week the Senate joined the House in support of the bipartisan economic stimulus plan to help hardworking Americans struggling to afford the high costs of energy, health care, gas, mortgage payments and other necessities. The bipartisan stimulus plan will put hundreds of dollars back into the hands of more than 130 million American families to promote economic growth in our slowing economy and create jobs.

The measure sent to President Bush includes:

- Tax cuts for More than 130 Million Families.
- Unprecedented Tax Relief for Low-Income Working Families.
- Rebates for 20 Million Additional Seniors and 250,000 Disabled Veterans.
- Tax Fairness and Targeted Rebates.
- Safeguards that ensure that Undocumented Workers Cannot Receive Rebates.
- Helping Families Avoid Foreclosure.
- Encouraging Business Investment.

Scott Praises Passage of Higher Education Bill Scott's Legislation included as Amendment February 7

Today the U.S. House of Representatives passed the H.R. 4137, the College Opportunity and Affordability Act by a vote of 354-58. Included in H.R. 4137 is legislation introduced by Congressman Scott - the **John R. Justice Prosecutors and Defenders Act of 2007** (H.R. 916) - which passed the House on May 15, 2007 by a 341-73 vote.

Congressman Scott praised the inclusion of his legislative langue, which will encourage current and future law students to pursue a public service career following graduation from law school.

"A serious situation is emerging impacting public safety, justice, fairness and the integrity of the criminal justice system, as a severe shortage of qualified prosecutors and public defenders looms large over our entire nation," Congressman Scott said. "In Georgia and throughout the country, the recruitment and retention of public prosecutors and defenders has been a daunting task in recent years. This is largely because crushing student debt burdens have deterred many talented law graduates from pursuing public service careers."

Today, Congressman David Scott honored the extraordinary service and accomplishments of Lieutenant General Russel L. Honoré, United State Army, with House Resolution 944. Lt. Mortgage Crisis Update: Congressman Scott Shares Recent Resources with Distressed Homeowners

During the peak period for interest rate resets on adjustable-rate loans many borrowers are finding it difficult to meet their new monthly payments and are in danger of foreclosure.

The Financial Services Committee continues to encourage borrowers to seek assistance before they get into serious trouble, and avert as many foreclosures as possible. The Hope Now Alliance, a joint effort involving the Homeownership Preservation Foundation, NeighborWorks America, and a consortium of mortgage lenders and servicers, has released a nationwide toll-free hotline – 1-888-995-HOPE – to help connect borrowers with assistance from independent, non-profit counselors certified by the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Free counseling is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can also visit <u>www.995hope.com</u> for assistance.

The Alliance has also released phone numbers for the individual servicing companies, and encourages borrowers with questions about their loans to contact their servicer directly.

Congressman Scott Salutes the Tuskegee Airmen

Today, I honor one of America's most courageous groups of men who fought during World War II, the Tuskegee Airmen. These brave African American men refused to let discrimination topple their dreams as they fought to defend America during World War II and protect our freedom. They are nationally known for being the first group of black military airmen at a time when people believed all blacks lacked intelligence, skill, courage and patriotism.

Coming out of the Tuskegee Institute as some of the best and brightest of their programs, they went on to fight against all odds. These men were a vital part of the battles against the Luftwaffe in Austria, Hungary, Poland and Germany. They flew more than 15,000 sorties, escorted bombers in raids against enemies over Europe and North Africa, and destroyed enemy targets and supply lines in Germany. Their efforts and successes in the Air Force directly influenced President Truman's decision to desegregate the U.S. military. Due to their patriotism and valor in World War II on March 27, 2007 they received the one of the highest honors in the United States, the Congressional Gold Medal.

When people talk about the Tuskegee Airmen, it is more than just their flying. It is their extraordinary stand for courage in the face of difficulty. This month I salute the Tuskegee Airmen.

Scott Participates in Financial Services Subcommittee Hearing on Diversity in the Financial Service Industry

Today, Congressman David Scott joined Congressman Mel Watt (D-NC), Chairman of the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, in a subcommittee hearing on diversity in the financial services industry. This hearing focused on the employment, retention and promotion of minorities and women at all levels in the financial services sector.

Congressman Scott said, "The hearing's topic of diversity in the financial services industry is of particular interest to me for several reasons. The most important being the need to open access to capital in minority communities. America's strength is that it has always been a place of diversity, and we are proud of this fact, and this should be reflected in the workforce, in particular the financial services sector. As an entrepreneur who attended the Wharton School of Finance, I understand the unique challenges facing minorities, especially in the financial service industry."

In 2005, Members of the House Financial Services Committee, including Congressman Scott, requested that the Government Accountability Office (GAO) study diversity in the financial services industry over the last 10 years. According to the GAO report, which was released in 1996: "Between 1993 and 2004, overall diversity at the management level in the financial services industry did not change substantially, but some racial/ethnic minority groups experienced more change in representation than others."

Scott Supports Career and Technical Education

Today, Congressman Scott recognized the goals and ideals of Career and Technical Education Month with the support of H.R. 930. Career and technical education remains an important area of education for individuals who may not pursue a traditional liberal arts education. This resolution (1) supports the goals and ideals of Career and Technical Education month, (2) recognizes the importance of career and

technical education in preparing a well-educated and skilled workforce in America, and (3) encourages educators, counselors, and administrators to promote career and technical education as an option to students.

Congressman Scott has previously supported funding for the Perkins Act, which provides federal funding to states for skills-based educational programs and prepares students for post-secondary education or careers in specific trades.

Legislative News: Recent Votes by Congressman Scott:

H.R. 4137 – College Opportunity and Affordability Act of 2007

To address the rising cost of post-secondary education, H.R. 4137, the College Opportunity and Affordability Act, increases transparency to encourage more disclosure concerning the cost of tuition and related expenses, so that students can make a better-informed decision when financing their post-secondary education. Such disclosures will encourage states and universities to make an effort to reduce the cost of tuition or at least explain why costs must go up. Additionally, this measure will simplify the Free Application for Financial Student Aid (FAFSA) by not only reducing the number of questions on the questionnaire but also eliminating the requirement that students must submit a FAFSA each year aid is sought, unless information has changed. The College Opportunity and Affordability Act also increases support for Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

DS voted FOR H.R. 4137; H.R. 4137 passed 354-58 (2-07-2008)

H.R. 5140 – Recovery Rebates and Economic Stimulus for the American People Act of 2008

Amends the Internal Revenue Code to grant tax rebates of the lesser of net income tax liability or \$600 to individual taxpayers (\$1,200 for married taxpayers filing joint returns). Allows additional rebates of \$300 for each child of an eligible taxpayer. Provides for a minimum tax rebate of \$300 (\$600 for married taxpayers filing joint returns) for taxpayers with earned income of at least \$3,000. Includes social security retirement benefits and compensation and pension benefits paid to disabled veterans

for purposes of determining income eligibility for rebates. **DS voted FOR H.R. 5140; H.R.5140 passed 380-34 (2-07-2008)**

H.R. 5351 – Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation Tax Act of 2008

Amends Internal Revenue Code provisions relating to renewable energy sources and energy conservation. Extends: (1) the tax credit for production of electricity from renewable resources through 2011; (2) the energy tax credit for solar energy and fuel cell property through 2016; (3) the special rule for treatment of gain from electronic transmission transactions by certain electric utilities through 2009; (4) the tax credit for residential energy efficient property expenditures through 2014; (5) the tax credit for alternative fuel vehicle refueling property expenditures through 2010; (6) the tax credit for biodiesel and renewable diesel used as fuel through 2010; (7) the tax credit for non-business energy property expenditures through 2009; and (8) the tax deduction for energy efficient commercial buildings through 2013.

DS voted FOR H.R. 5351; H.R. 5351 passed the House 236-182 (2-27-2008)
