2008 Farm Bill – Provisions to help farmers and ranchers throughout the 28th Congressional District Water Resources Development Act of 2007—Provisions to improve water resources affecting rural and urban areas of the 28th Congressional District

☑ Making Government Fiscally Responsible: Pay As You Go

- Allowing no new deficit spending
- Balancing the budget by 2012
- Passing legislation in the House to save U.S. taxpayers billions by cleaning up government contracting abuses, including getting rid of nobid contracts
- Instituting unprecedented disclosure of which Members are requesting earmarked projects and who is benefiting, and dramatically cutting the number of earmarks
- Uncovering billions of misspent taxpayer dollars in Iraq

☑ Giving Americans a Tax Break: Helping You Keep Your Hard-**Earned Money**

The Temporary Tax Relief Act of 2007 protects 23 million middle-class families from being forced to pay the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT). Without this legislation, the number of people who pay AMT in South Texas would have increased by 1500% in 2007. H.R. 3996 will prevent the AMT from unfairly reaching into the pockets of middle-income families, while also extending tax credits and deductions that will benefit a wide array of Americans and the American economy. In addition to tax relief, H.R. 3996 would:

- Extend the current deduction for college tuition and allow homeowners to deduct up to \$500 of property taxes in addition to their standard deduction
- Increase the eligibility of the refundable child tax credit in 2008 and make it refundable to the extent of 15 percent of the taxpayer's earned income
- Continues the sales tax deduction in the State of Texas from federal income tax

☑ Protecting Our Children: State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP):

I have long been an advocate for children's health. The 1.3 million children in the State of Texas who have no access to health care coverage continue to be my priority. I will continue working with my colleagues to defend Medicaid and cover 10 million children from low-income working families who need and deserve quality healthcare.
