The Details

- What: A Fellowship serving in the office of Congressman Geoff Davis with a monthly stipend of \$1,000 (\$4,000 total).
- Where: In Washington, D.C.

When: From August 20th to December 14th, 2007

Who: Any Northern Kentucky University student, with preference given to constituents residing in the 4th Congressional District of Kentucky. Interested applicants should be able to work in a team environment, have strong research, writing, and organizational skills, and possess a similar commitment to public service as demonstrated by Congressman Gene Snyder.

Why: To gain valuable experience while learning the inner-workings of a Congressional office in Washington, D.C., first hand.

How: Mail a completed application to our Ft. Mitchell Office c/o the Intern Coordinator by April 1, 2007. All finalists will be interviewed in the Ft. Mitchell office.
