## **Keeping Families Healthy**

Each year thousands of Americans die from diseases such as the flu and pneumonia that can be prevented by safe and effective vaccines. To address this tragedy, the congresswoman is the author of the "Total Health Requires Improved Vaccination Efforts (THRIVE) Act of 2005." The measure would strengthen public outreach to adults about the importance of immunizations.

As a member of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services and Education, the congresswoman is working to pass three measures to cover more than half of the nation's 45 million uninsured.

- ▲ **The Small Business Health Insurance Promotion Act** would provide a tax credit to small business owners to offer coverage to their employees.
- ▲ **The Family Care Act** would cover low-income working parents whose children already qualify for state and federally provided health care.
- ▲ **The Medicare Early Access Act** would allow uninsured seniors between the ages of 55 and 64 to buy into Medicare for health care coverage.

### **Getting Around**

Congresswoman Roybal-Allard recently secured more than \$14 million for transportation projects that will make getting around town easier and safer. Through her efforts, federal awards will be received for important projects such as bridge repairs, street improvements, traffic signal upgrades and the reduction of diesel truck emissions:

- **\$1.24 million** for the City of Bellflower
- **\$800,000** for the City of Bell Gardens
- **\$2.4 million** for the City of Commerce
- **\$4.4 million** for the City of Downey
- \$960,000 for the City of Huntington Park
- **\$3 million** for the City of Los Angeles
- ➡ \$400,000 for Los Angeles County
- **\$400,000** for the City of Maywood
- **\$800,000** for the City of Vernon

# **Protecting Our Homeland**

ne of Congresswoman Roybal-Allard's top priorities is to ensure that our police, firefighters and other emergency personnel have the resources they need to respond to and, above all, prevent terrorist attacks. As a member on the Appropriations Homeland Security Subcommittee, she is working aggressively to ensure that the pending homeland security spending bill contains critical improvements for the coming year. In addition, in light of the London bombings, she recently met with representatives of the Los Angeles Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Amtrak, Metrolink and other transit systems to learn firsthand about their security measures and funding needs.

A member of the Appropriations Homeland Security Subcommittee, Congresswoman Lucille Roybal-Allard toured the Port of Los Angeles in



May on a U.S. Coast Guard 25-foot fast response boat with Rear Admiral Kevin J. Eldridge, U.S. Coast Guard, Commander, Eleventh District. The armed speed boats are used in homeland security and law enforcement missions. Prior to the tour, she met with members of the Central California Area Maritime Security Committee which is made up of representatives from industry, labor, law enforcement, and first responder agencies at the federal, state, and local levels. They work together to protect the Los Angeles-Long Beach Port Complex.

### **Supporting Business**

The congresswoman welcomed the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce's 52-member lobbying team during its annual "ACCESS DC" visit to Capitol Hill. Chamber members met with the congresswoman and a bipartisan group of congressional leaders that included Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi (CA-8) and House Appropriations Chairman Jerry Lewis (CA- 41) to discuss legislative priorities such as the need for increased federal dollars for transportation, education and homeland security.

The congresswoman knows that successful small businesses strengthen our communities. To learn about the issues of most concern to owners, managers and employees, she recently visited three **Vernon**-based companies: the Red Chamber Company; Hannibal Industries, Inc.; and Home Best. She also met with chamber leaders throughout the 34th Congressional District to help coordinate efforts in support of small business and to identify topics for future workshops and seminars. In recognition of her work, the **Boyle Heights** Chamber of Commerce honored her in March with its Legislator of the Year Award.

### Helping Survivors of Domestic Violence

Understanding that economic security is essential to breaking the cycle of abuse for victims of domestic violence, the congresswoman is leading the effort to pass legislation she authored to help women become financially free of their abusers.

## *"The Security and Financial Empowerment Act (SAFE)" would:*

- ▲ allow survivors up to 30 days of unpaid leave from work to go to court, see a doctor, or find a safe place to live.
- ▲ provide a uniform federal standard for all states to offer unemployment insurance to victims forced to leave their jobs as a result of domestic abuse.
- ▲ authorize a national resource center to provide assistance to employers and labor organizations to help victims.

In recognition of the congresswoman's longstanding advocacy in Congress on

behalf of victims of domestic violence, the Los Angeles County Commission for Women honored her with its **2005 President's Award**.

## Curbing Underage Drinking

ongresswoman Roybal-Allard has been the leader in the national effort to combat the crisis of underage drinking in our country. Based on research that found most young people obtain alcohol from a parent or another adult, she successfully secured federal funding for a multimedia Ad Council campaign directed at parents. To create a steady source of funding for the national media campaign, she recently introduced a bipartisan bill called the "STOP (Sober Truth On Preventing underage drinking) Act." The STOP Act would also create a federal inter-agency committee to coordinate all federal activities on underage drinking, and authorize funding to provide states, non-profits and institutions of higher education with competitive grants to create statewide coalitions to prevent underage drinking and alcohol abuse on college campuses. For her efforts, the congresswoman was nationally honored by Mothers Against Drunk Driving, the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA) and Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD).
