H.R. 222 Amendment in Nature of Substitute Key Changes to CIEDRA- H.R. 222

- Eliminated Parcel B, the conveyance of 86 acres of SNRA land to Custer County above Stanley (Nip and Tuck) which they could have sold for 10 buildable lots.
- Eliminated Parcel A, the conveyance of 8 acres of SNRA land to the City of Stanley which could have been sold for 4 buildable lots.
- Created up to \$3 million fund for Custer County to compensate for the lost 86 acres in Parcel B. Directs that 25% of all proceeds resulting from the leasing of minerals on federal lands within the State of Idaho shall be used for grants for Custer County.
- Provides up to \$200,000 for the construction of a community amphitheater in Stanley.
- Removes \$50,000 for the construction of mountain bike trails within the state of Idaho.
- Grants to Custer County can be used for "economic development" and additionally "other purposes".
- Removed \$500,000 for construction of Herd Lake Campground.
- Changed the mining provision so that the Secretary "may" offer up to \$20,000 for the acquisition of patented interests in claims or property. The Secretary is no longer required to offer \$20,000.
- New wildfire Management language as used in current bills going through the House Resources Committee.
- The term and reference to the Boulder White Clouds Management Area is eliminated. We will now have a map that outlines the perimeter and the lands will either be wilderness or managed as they currently are as the Challis National Forest, the Sawtooth National Forest, the Sawtooth National Recreation Area, and the Challis District of the Bureau of Land Management.
- Allows the federal agencies to update their management plans as necessary.
- For the \$1,000,000 authorization to be used for the state ORV program removed "acquisition and purchase" of lands. The funds must be used for motorized trail improvements/grooming and any other activity related to enhancing existing trails within the Boulder-White Clouds area.
