HIII Highlights Legislative Action From the Week Ending 5/5/2006

H.R. 5253 Prohibiting Fuel Price Gouging

This bill prohibits price gouging in the wholesale or retail sale of crude oil, gasoline, diesel, home heating oil, or biofuels. The measure sets fines for individuals or businesses found to have engaged in price gouging in the sale of fuels. The bill also allows the Justice Department to bring criminal charges against individuals or businesses for price gouging in the sale of fuels. It also allows states to file lawsuits on behalf of state residents against retailers or wholesalers for price gouging. I voted in support of this measure, which passed the House by a vote of 389 to 34.

H.R. 5254 Creating the Refinery Permit Process Schedule Act

This bill requires the President to identify at least three new sites on closed military bases that are suitable for new oil refineries within 90 days of enactment. It also replaces a federal-state process with the creation of a new federal coordinator to speed the application process for the construction of new refineries. This measure also authorizes the Environmental Protection Agency to provide financial assistance, at a state's request, to hire employees to assist a state with applications to build or expand refineries. It allows any federal agency to provide technical, legal, or other non-financial aid to help states apply for new or expanded refineries. I voted against this measure. Its passage failed by a vote of 237 to 188.

H.R. 4975 Establishing the Lobbying Accountability & Transparency Act

This bill bans privately funded travel by House members prior to June 15 unless two-thirds of the Committee on Standards of Official Conduct (the "Ethics Committee") votes to certify that the travel complies with House Rules and standards of conduct. It also requires the Ethics Committee to report its recommendations for changes to the House rule on privately funded travel by June 15. The measure denies retirement benefits to House members who have been convicted of felonies related to their official position. It also requires mandatory ethics training for all House employees and permits withholding the pay of any House employee who does not complete such ethics training. The bill directs the Ethics Committee to establish a similar program for House members and to encourage members to take part in that program. It also requires lobbyists to file quarterly instead of semiannual reports. I did not sup-

H. R. 4954 Ensuring Security and Accountability For Every Port (SAFE Port)

This bill authorizes approximately \$5 billion over six years for port and cargo security programs and measures, including \$400 million annually for riskbased grant programs. It also requires the evaluation of next-generation cargo scanning technology to determine the feasibility of deploying it at foreign ports. This measure requires ports to submit security plans upon transfer of ownership. It also requires that port workers, merchant mariners, and truck drivers have security cards, sets deadlines for developing regulations for a transportation security card for port employees, and establishes interim background and immigration verification procedures. This bill requires Homeland Security to complete an automated vessel tracking system by 2007. It also authorizes funding to accelerate the Coast Guard's Deepwater program for replacing deteriorating ships and equipment, provides formal authorization for the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office, and authorizes a Policy, Planning and International Affairs Directorate within the Department of Homeland Security. I voted in favor of this measure, which passed the House by a vote of 421 to 2.

Thurgood Marshall successfully argued the 1954 landmark case Brown v. Board of Education, which ordered the desegregation of public schools. He later became the first African-American appointed to serve as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. Established in 1987 to carry on Justice Marshall's legacy of equal access to higher education, the Thurgood Marshall Scholarship Fund offers a variety of scholarship opportunities.
