Hill Highlights Legislative Action for 3/31/08 through 4/4/08

H. R. 3352/NOAA Hydrographic Services Expansion — This bill authorizes the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to expand the use of hydrographic data and hydrographic services to support conservation, protect life and property, support the resumption of commerce after emergencies, and contribute to homeland security and maritime domestic awareness. Congresswoman Kilpatrick voted for this legislation, which passed the House by a vote of 308 to 60.

H. R. 5501/Global AIDS Program Reauthorization — This landmark legislation authorizes a total of \$50 billion over five years to combat HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria around the globe. The bill replaces the current requirement that one-third of the program's funding be for efforts to promote abstinence with a new requirement that the program provide "balanced funding" to promote abstinence, fidelity, and condom use. The bill's goals include preventing 12 million new HIV infections, providing life-saving drugs for three million AIDS patients, providing medical and non-medical care for 12 million people (including five million orphans), and training 140,000 new health care workers. The Congresswoman supported this measure, which passed by a vote of 308 to 116.

H. R. 4847/Funding Fire Control and Prevention — This bill authorizes a total of \$293 million for the U.S. Fire Administration through fiscal year 2012. It provides for training of fire service personnel in dealing with national catastrophes, including incidents from terrorism and weapons of mass destruction. The Congresswoman voted in support of this legislation, which passed the House unanimously.
