This Week In Congress:

TRANSPORTATION BILL H.R. 3550

The Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (TEA-LU), provides \$275 billion in federal funds for highways and public transit over a six year period. Congressman Steven LaTourette, a Republican from Ohio, and I introduced the bi-partisan "Buy America" amendment that would; require that 60 percent of components and subcomponents in a manufactured product be American made, requires all manufactured products be assembled in the United States, and requires all steel be American made. The House accepted the amendment by a voice vote. TEA-LU passed with a vote of 357-65.

MEDICARE/Rx DRUG TOWN HALL MEETING

I will be holding a series of Medicare/Rx Drug Town Hall meetings that will explain the changes in the new Medicare Law. These meetings will feature a video produced by "Families USA" and narrated by renown journalist Walter Cronkite.
