Dear Chairman Baucus and Ranking Member Grassley:

We write to you today on an issue of great importance to our nation's physicians and the seniors they care for. Recent press reports indicate that you are close to a bipartisan compromise on Medicare physician reimbursement that would avert the scheduled 10.6 percent cut to physicians set to go into effect on July 1,2008, without cutting private fee-for-service (PFFS) plans under Medicare Advantage. We urge you to produce a bipartisan bill that protects seniors that depend on Medicare Advantage and report such a bill to the Senate floor for quick consideration.

Unfortunately, the House-passed bill, H.R. 6331, cuts \$13.6 billion from Medicare Advantage over the next five years and nearly \$50 billion over 10 years. As a result of this legislation, current PFFS plans could be taken away from seniors in 41 states, and according to CBO more than 2 million seniors will be lose their PFFS plans by 2013. Almost 50 percent of Medicare Advantage enrollees have incomes less than \$20,000, and Medicare Advantage plans are the most popular option for beneficiaries with incomes between \$10,000 and \$20,000.

All of us are committed to ensuring that our physicians can continue to practice across the country and provide the best care to our seniors. Without adequate reimbursement and certainty about the reimbursements they are going to receive, we fear that many doctors will simply be unable to see new Medicare patients. We cannot allow these cuts to take effect. Our seniors deserve better, and our physicians deserve better.

We understand that Sen. Majority Leader Harry Reid may be inclined to bring up the House bill, H.R. 6331, as early as Thursday, June 26, due to the wide margin of passage; but we urge you to keep working on a compromise bill that does not include cuts to Medicare Advantage private fee-for-service plans.

Thank you for your continued attention to this important issue, and we look forward to your bill.
