## **Returning to Santa Rosa Island**

Dear Neighbor,

I recently had the opportunity to return to beautiful Santa Rosa Island, part of Channel Islands National Park. Even though the island is 25 miles south of Santa Barbara and 40 miles west of Ventura, it remains beautifully rustic and isolated, with just a handful of manmade structures. The visit confirmed my belief that Santa Rosa is one of the jewels of the National Park System.

Unfortunately, taxpayers—who paid \$30 million for the island in 1986—are denied access to almost all of Santa





Rosa for four or five months of the year, while a lucrative private hunting operation arranges trophy hunts of non-native deer and elk. A court settlement guaranteed that the private hunt would be phased out by 2011, but Rep. Duncan Hunter (R-Calif.) inserted a provision in the recent defense authorization bill to maintain the hunt indefinitely, under the guise of providing trophy hunts for paralyzed veterans. Actually, the Paralyzed Veterans of America—the group Rep. Hunter claimed supported his idea—opposes the plan as "not viable," because of Santa Rosa's rugged terrain and isolated location.


National Parks should be open to all of us, not set aside as private hunting grounds. I am pleased to report that on August 3, the Senate unanimously passed a resolution (S. Res. 468) that strongly supports full public access to the island. I will continue to fight to ensure the public's access to Santa Rosa.
