  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "E-mail Privacy Act
  - 5 of 2004".
  - 6 SEC. 2. INTERCEPTIONS.
  - 7 Section 2510(4) of title 18, United States Code, is
  - 8 amended—

1	(1)	by	striking	the	period	at	the	end;	and

2 (2) by inserting ", and, with respect to an elec-3 tronic communication, includes the acquisition of the 4 contents of the communication through the use of 5 any electronic, mechanical, or other device, at any 6 point between the point of origin and the point when 7 it is made available to the recipient" after "device".

### 8 SEC. 3. LIMITATION OF SERVICE PROVIDER EXCEPTION.

9 Section 2701(c)(1) of title 18, United States Code, 10 is amended by inserting "to the extent the access is a nec-11 essary incident to the rendition of the service, the protec-12 tion of the rights or property of the provider of that serv-13 ice, or compliance with section 2702" after "service".
