Excluding Supplemental Spending, the Committee bill is:

\$1,091 million or 6% below last year and

\$221 million or 1.3% above the request.

Including Supplemental Spending, the Committee Bill is: \$1,570 million or 8.5% below last year.

NOTE: The figures for FY 03 and the President's Request provided by the Appropriations Committee differ from those provided by CBO and the Budget Committee. This box utilizes CBO and Budget Committee figures.

PROHIBITIONS:

<u>Drug Reimportation</u>: Prohibits the FDA from preventing an individual who is not in the business of importing prescription drugs, a wholesaler, or a pharmacist from reimporting prescription drugs that comply with other FDA requirements.

FAIR ACT / A-76 Activities: Prohibits funds for the Chief Financial Officer from being obligated for FAIR Act or Circular A-76 activities until the Secretary has submitted to the Committees on Appropriations of both Houses of Congress a report on the Department's contracting out policies, including agency budgets for contracting out.

<u>Rural Firefighters and Emergency Personnel Grant Program:</u> Prohibits the payment of personnel to carry out this program as authorized in the most recent Farm Bill.

<u>Review of the Agriculture Research Service:</u> Prohibits the payment of personnel to conduct a review of the Agricultural Research Service and to conduct a review of the purpose, efficiency, effectiveness, and impact on agricultural research of the Agricultural Research Service as required by the most recent Farm Bill.

<u>Country of Origin Labeling:</u> Prevents the implementation of country of origin labeling for meat or meat products.

<u>Wetlands Reserve Enrollment:</u> Prohibits the payment of personnel to enroll in excess of 200,000 acres in calendar year 2004 in the wetlands reserve program.

<u>Energy Improvement Grants:</u> Prohibits the payment of personnel to make loans, loan guarantees, and grants to farmers, ranchers, and rural small businesses to (1) purchase renewable energy systems; and (2) make energy efficiency improvements as directed under the most recent Farm Bill.

<u>Broadband loans:</u> Prohibits the payment of personnel to carryout the mandatory broadband access loan program authorized in the most recent Farm Bill.

<u>Value-Added Grants</u>: Prohibits the payment of personnel to carryout the value-added agriculture product market development grant program authorized in the most recent Farm Bill.

Designation of Communities As Rural & Other Community Specific Provisions:

Permits, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Natural Resources Conservation Service to provide financial and technical assistance for the Ditch 26 project in Arkansas; further provides that they shall provide financial and technical assistance to the DuPage County, Illinois, Kress Creek Watershed Plan, from funds available for the Watershed and Flood Prevention Operations program, not to exceed \$1,600,000, and Rockhouse Creek Watershed, Leslie County, Kentucky, not to exceed \$1,000,000.

Designates, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the County of Lawrence, Ohio; the City of Havelock, North Carolina; the City of Portsmouth, Ohio; the City of Atascadero, California; the City of Binghamton, New York; the Town of Vestal, New York; the City of Ithaca, New York; the City of Casa Grande, Arizona; and the City of Clarksdale, Mississippi, as meeting the eligibility requirements for loans and grants programs in the Rural Development mission area.

LANGUAGE & FUNDING OF NOTE:

<u>Farmer's Markets in Big Cities:</u> Permits the use of funds for the design and development of wholesale and farmer market facilities for major metropolitan areas.

International School Lunch Program: Includes \$56.9 million for the McGovern-Dole International School Lunch Program

EARMARKS:

The bill earmarks millions of dollars for specific agriculture research projects not requested by the Administration.

Among the Hundreds of Earmarks: Wool Research: \$300,000 Wood Utilization Research: \$6,130,000 Midwest Poultry Consortium (IA): \$695,000 Cotton Fiber Quality (GA): \$500,000 Asparagus Technology & Production: \$278,000 Greenhouse Nurseries (OH): \$797,000 (NEW) Monitoring Agriculture Sewage Sludge Application (OH): \$1,200,000 (NEW) Sustainable Agriculture Freshwater Conservation (TX): \$2,000,000 (NEW)
