Alexandria Agency Threatens To Use Eminent Domain
To Seize Land (nbc4.com-3/21/08)

A city agency in Alexandria (VA) is threatening to use the power of eminent domain to take a piece of property its owner had hoped to sell to developers. Realtor Charles Hooff's family has partially owned a piece of land near the Wilson Bridge since they settled in Alexandria in the 1700s.

Hooff struck a deal to sell the land for office and residential development. The Alexandria Sewer Authority, however, wants to expand a sewer plant next to the property.

The plant serves Alexandria and Fairfax County. Officials said they need to expand it to keep up with growth. Hooff has been offered close to \$50 million by one developer. He said the sewer authority has offered just \$20 million. "Give us fair market value, and we'll be on our way," Hooff said.
