Honor Americans Killed by Terrorists

Dear Colleague,

This past March, I introduced H. Con. Res. 119, a resolution that offers Congress' condolences to the loved ones of those innocent Americans that have been killed in Israel, and calls on the Palestinian Authority to work with Israel to protect *all* innocent people (regardless of citizenship) from terrorist violence. This resolution recognizes the 38 Americans by listing those killed and the circumstances surrounding their deaths.

Sadly, since H. Con. Res. 119 was introduced four more Americans have been murdered by Palestinian terrorists. Since Yasser Arafat, on behalf of the Palestinian people, renounced violence in the Oslo Peace Accords on September 13, 1993, at least 42 American have been killed by Palestinian terrorists. At least another 79 Americans have been injured in terrorist attacks.

In light of these events, I ask you again to honor the memories of those innocent Americans killed by terrorists in Israel. To cosponsor H. Con. Res. 119, please contact Andrew Wankum of my staff at 5-3711.
