


# Wilson votes to honor America's veterans

I am proud to have voted for HR 2672, the largest single increase in funding to our Veterans Administration in history.

### HR 2672 - Military Construction and Veterans Affairs Appropriations Act

- The House of Representatives has passed HR 2672, the largest single increase in the 77-year history of the Veterans Administration.
- I was proud to vote for the \$65 billion spending bill that protects military personnel and their families from the health care fee increases the President has proposed. In fact, it provides \$3.8 billion more than the President requested.
- The Veterans Health Administration estimates it will treat more than 5.8 million patients in 2008 including more than 263,345 veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan, 54,000 more than fiscal year 2007.

### The legislation includes:

- \$600 million for a new mental health initiative and for the treatment of post-traumatic stress disorder.
- \$130 million for homeless veterans.
- \$4.1 billion for medical facilities.
- \$480 million in funding for medical and prosthetic research.
- \$165 million for the construction and modification of extended care facilities for veterans.

### I am also proud to have cosponsored HR 2005, the Rural Veterans Health Care Improvement Act of 2007.

For veterans receiving treatment at VA facilities, this bill would authorize the VA to pay travel expenses at the level paid to federal employees. Currently that rate is 48.5 cents per mile. This bill would also establish Centers for Excellence for rural health research in order to directly improve the quality of care for our veterans who live in rural areas like ours.

### In addition, I cosponsored HR 579, the Military Retirees Health Care Protection Act.

If passed, this bill would prohibit increases in premiums and deductibles under TRICARE and prohibit charges for DOD inpatient care from exceeding \$535 per day. This bill is important because it would lock in premiums and deductibles to ensure that our veterans get good quality care at prices they can afford.
