



Iraq War Funding Totals \$653 Billion through 2009




*Bridge reflects only partial year funding. The Administration plans to ask for a 2009 supplemental appropriation to finance the remainder of the year.

Monthly "Burn Rate" for Iraq is Currently \$10 Billion




Iraq's Oil Production Only Recently Reached Pre-War Level

Iraq Possesses the Third Largest Oil Reserves in the World


